Sub: Complaint against Sindh Police for Corruption in Purchase of Toyota Mobiles of the Government of Sindh.

Dear Sir,

Transparency International Pakistan has received a complaint that massive corruption has occurred in purchase of more than 500 Toyota vans since last 2 years in Sindh police.

The complainant has made following allegations;

1. Toyota vans are purchased from the company with standard cabin at the prescribed cost.
2. Under the provision of proprietary item, Sindh police awarded additional work on these vans to make them bullet proof and bomb proof at a huge cost of Rs.2 Million - Rs.10 Million, each without any competitive bidding at almost thrice the market price.
3. The original cabin of these vans are returned to the company to be sold and used in their own manufacturing, and the compensation was pocketed by Government of Sindh, procuring agency top management, which is estimated to be over Rs.100 Million.

Director General, NAB is requested to kindly examine the complaint, and if the allegations are found correct, NAB take necessary action against all those officers involved in corrupt practices.

Transparency International Pakistan is striving for across the board application of Rule of Law, which is the only way to stop corruption.
