**Subject: Transparency International Pakistan's Recommendations on Uploading Updated Information on the Website of Energy Department, Govt. of Pakistan, Ensuring Citizens Access to Climate Data as per Article 19A of the Constitution of Pakistan, Right of Access to Information Act, 2017, Supreme Court of Pakistan Judgement in CP No. 3532/2023**

Dear Sir,

Transparency International Pakistan would like to draw your attention towards its recently released report titled "State of Data Disclosure of Climate Related Departments as per Access to Information Laws". The full report is available at: <https://transparency.org.pk/PUBLICATION/State-of-Data-Disclosure-under-Access-to-Information-Laws-by-Climate-Related-Departments-in-Pakistan-October-2024.pdf>. One of the departments included in this assessment is the Energy Department, Government of Pakistan. Its average disclosure rate is 58%, **(Annex A & B)** which must be improved to ensure compliance with Section 5, "Publication and Availability of Record" of the Right of Access to Information Act, 2017.

Climate related departments have a central role in climate action in Pakistan. Access to updated information ensures effective implementation of climate strategies, stakeholder's participation and a coordinated response. It builds trust among the local communities disproportionately affected by climate change, enhances transparency and encourages confidence among international institutions, necessary for an effective access to much needed climate finance.


The honorable Prime Minister is requested to issue directives for compliance with Right of Access to Information Act 2017, section 5, Publication and Availability of Record, which mandates departments to proactively disclose information through their websites. It is also a mandatory obligation on public bodies under Article 19-A of the Constitution of Islamic Republic of Pakistan, as well as the honorable Supreme Court of Pakistan judgment dated 16 October 2023, in CP No. 3532/2023, which declared that;

*"What previously may have been on a need-to-know basis Article 19A of the Constitution has transformed it to a right-to-know, and the Access to information is no longer a discretion granted through occasional benevolence, but is now a fundamental right available with every Pakistani which right may be invoked under Article 19A of the Constitution"*

Transparency International Pakistan remains available for any technical assistance department may require, implementing the recommendations.

Transparency International Pakistan is striving for across the board application of Rule of Law, which is the only way to eradicate corruption.
